ADULT DAY PROGRAM

- 223 patients were discharged.
- The average age of patients discharged was 57 years. The age range of patients admitted to the program was 19 to 90 years.

The # of patients in each age bracket was:

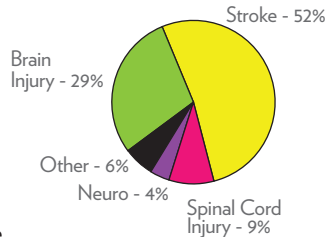
18 or younger = 0 19 to 30 years = 31
31 to 49 years = 45 50 to 64 years = 76
65 and older = 71

- Patients participated in an average of 18.5 program days.
- 97% of patients were satisfied overall with the services they received.
- 100% of patients were discharged home and 98% of those reached for follow-up were still living at home 1 year after discharge.
- 100% of patients reached by phone had returned to work, school or home management 90 days after discharge, as applicable.
- 29 patients unexpectedly returned to acute care during their program.

TWELVE MONTH REVIEW OF PROGRAM OUTCOMES AT THE REHABILITATION INSTITUTE OF KC THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2015

ADULT OUTPATIENT PROGRAM

- 163 patients were discharged.
- The average age of patients discharged was 57.5 years. The age range of patients admitted to the program was 16 to 89 years. The number of patients in each age range was:

18 or younger = 2 19 to 30 years = 15
31 to 49 years = 42 50 to 64 years = 53
65 and older = 51

- Patients participated in an average of 9.5 Physical Therapy hours, 8.5 Occupational Therapy hours, and 8.5 Speech Therapy hours.
- 93% of patients' abilities to care for daily needs such as bathing and dressing improved or stayed the same 90 days post-discharge.
- 100% of patients were discharged home and 100% of those reached for follow-up were still living at home 90 days after discharge.
- 100% of patients surveyed felt their evaluation recommendations were helpful.
- 7 patients unexpectedly returned to acute care during their program.
