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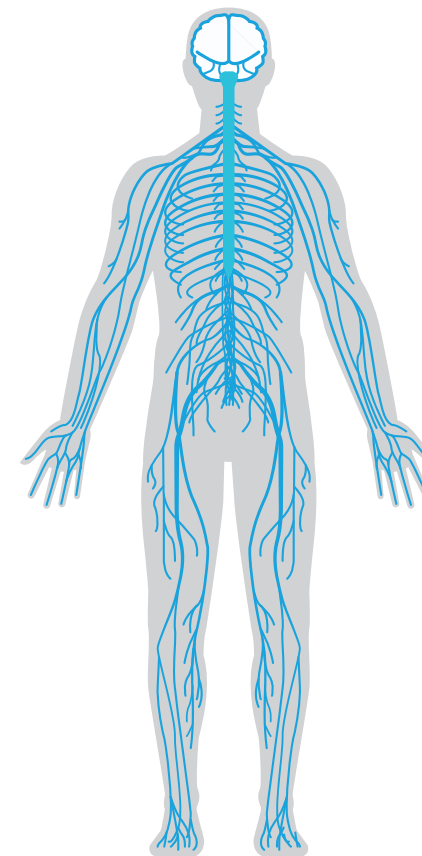

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CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

Multiple Sclerosis (MS) is the most common immune-mediated inflammatory demyelinating disease of the central nervous system. It is the leading cause of disability in young adults. The progressive nature of this disease results in unique challenges for the individual and their team of professionals working with them. This conference will address issues related to services provided within the medical, community, home and work environments.

OBJECTIVES / OUTCOMES

At the end of the conference, attendees/learners will be able to:

1. Discuss assistive technology considerations for work and environment.
2. Understand the number of choices available for the disease modification in early MS - risks and benefits.
3. Understand risk stratification of DMDs and individualizing choice of therapy.
